Procedure:

- I. Equipment
 - A. Depo-Provera injection
 - B. Alcohol swab
 - C. Band-Aid
 - D. Gloves
 - E. Depo flow sheet
 - F. Patient chart
 - G. Distribution log

II. Initial

- A. Patient must be seen by a provider and must have an order for the Depo injection in the electronic medical record. Patient must be on menses or regularly taking birth control pills, have a negative urine or venous HCG, or be at 6 week postpartum visit and breastfeeding, or five days from delivery if not breastfeeding.
- B. Take all vital signs.
- C. Review the warning signs, menstrual changes, and STD/HIV risks.
- D. Review the advantages and disadvantages.
- E. Explain the schedule for Depo-Provera and stress compliance (every 10-12 weeks).
- F. Give patient the education form on Depo-Provera.
- G. Explain that the patient must use condoms for 2 weeks following the initial injection as a precaution.
- H. Document on all of the above on a progress note and document injection on the Depo flowsheet.
- I. Apply gloves
- J. Give the injection into a large muscle Gluteal is 1st choice for most patients, however if patient is morbidly obese give shot in the deltoid muscle in the upper arm.
- K. Discard the syringe and needle into the sharps container and the gloves in the trash can.
- L. Complete the encounter form
- M. Give the patient the date card that shows a reinjection in 10-12 weeks.
- N. Educate on the importance of taking Calcium supplement daily.

III. Reinjection – N URSE VISIT

- A. Escort the patient to an exam room
- B. Obtain all vital signs
- C. Check the date of last injection to ensure it falls within the 10-12 week schedule. If more than 13 weeks past last injection, contact provider for orders.
- D. Assess menstrual bleeding
- E. Assess satisfaction with this birth control method.
- F. Educate on the importance of taking Calcium supplement daily.
- G. Give injection.
