DEFINITIONS:

To deliver a fine spray of medication or moisture to a patient with the use of nebulizer. Nebulization is the production of a fog or mist.

POLICY:

Upon provider order, nebulizer treatments will be given by nursing staff as directed using proper technique and universal precautions.

PROCEDURE:

Supplies & Equipment:

Nebulizer machine Nebulizer circuits with face mask (optional) 3cc syringe (if applicable) Pulse oximeter with appropriate size probe Oxygen tank on stand-by

Medication:

For pediatric patients: Appropriate solutions such as: Xopenex, Normal Saline (kept in refrigerator), premixed Albuterol Solution (alternative)

For adult patients: Albuterol solution (premixed in medication cabinet), Xopenex solution (premixed in medication cabinet)

- 1. Obtain needed equipment and ordered medication to set up in the exam room.
- 2. Wash your hands.
- 3. Check the patient's pulse and respiratory rate. Document the values in the medical record.
- 4. Obtain a pulse oximeter reading. Place the pulse oximeter on the patient to obtain a reading (*See Pulse Oximeter Procedure*). Record the value in the medical record. Inform

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- the provider immediately if readings are low (80s or low 90s) and have an oxygen tank nearby.
- 5. Draw up the ordered medication in the provided dropper and place in the medicine cup of the nebulizer circuit. Add 2 cc of normal saline into the medicine cup and connect the tubing to the medicine cup and machine. Premixed solutions may be used if available in the correct dosage.
- 6. Plug the nebulizer machine into the wall electrical receptacle.
- 7. Instruct the patient on how to use the nebulizer appropriately. Instruct the patient that it may take approximately 5 minutes to complete the treatment.
- 8. Turn the machine on.
- 9. When all the medication is gone from the medicine cup turn the machine off. Dispose of the nebulizer circuits in a waste receptacle. Return the nebulizer to the storage area and any unused medication to the refrigerator.
- 10. Wash your hands.
- 11. Notify the provider that the treatment is completed.
